Anas undulata	Duck, Yellowbilled	Eend, geelbek-	Resident - numbers can rise to 275 birds on one pan
Anomalospiza imberbis	Finch, Cuckoo	Vink, koekoek-	Spotted twice in the company of weavers - Slangpan
Anthropoidesparadisea	Crane, Blue	Kraanvoël, blou-	Only one record near Lake Chrissie
Anthus cinnamomeus	Pipit, Grassveld	Koester, grasveld-	Widespread
Anthus leucophrys	Pipit, Plainbacked	Koester, donker-	More open grasslands
Apus affinis	Swift, Little	Windswael, klein-	Irregular, no suitable resting sites
Apus barbatus	Swift, Black	Windswael, swart-	Subject to local movement
Apus caffer	Swift, Whiterumped	Windswael, witkruis-	Seen in Lake Chrissie village
Ardea cinerea	Heron, Grey	Reier, blou-	Widely distriubuted, numbers small
Ardea goliath	Heron, Goliath	Reier, reuse	Became established in the area in 2004.
Ardea melanocephala	Heron, Blackheaded	Reier, swartkop-	Partial to grasslands away from water
Ardea purpurea	Heron, Purple	Reier, rooi-	Partial to reeds and sedge-lined pans
Ardeola ralloides	Heron, Squacco	Reier, ral-	Uncommon, only seen shulking in reeds
Asio capensis	Owl, Marsh	Uil, vlei-	Seen quarterling the grasslands - usually at dark
Balearica regulorum	Crane, Crowned	Mahem	Regularly recorded around Lake Banagher - up to 180 birds
Bostrychia hagedash	Ibis,Hadeda	Hadeda	Everywhere
Bubo africanus	Owl, Eagle, Spotted	Uil, gevlekte oor-	Widespread known to compete with Egyptian Goose for nest
Bubo capensis	Owl, Eagle, Cape	Uil, Kaapse oor-	Seldom seen - reported to be resident
Bubulcus ibis	Egret, Cattle	Bosluisvoël	Abundant breeds in the reed beds
Burhinus vermiculatus	Dikkop, Spotted	Dikkop	Seen around the rocky outcrops
Buteo buteo vulpinus	Buzzard, Steppe	Jakkalsvoël, bruin-	Summer visitor
Buteo rufofuscus	Buzzard, Jackal	Jakkalsvoël, rooibors-	Not common
Calandrella cinerea	Lark, Redcapped	Lewerik, rooikop-	Partial to the short grass around the pans
Calidris ferruginea	Sandpiper, Curlew	Strandloper, krombek-	Flocks up to 75 in summer
Calidris minuta	Stint, Little	Strandloper, klein-	Most widespread weeder. Some over winter
Caprimulgus pectoralis	Nightjar, Fierynecked	Naguil, Afrikaanse	Not common
Cassypha caffra	Robin, Cape	Janfrederik, gewone	Farm dwellings
Cercomela familiaris	Chat, Familiar	Spekvreter, gewone	Around dwellings
Ceryle maxima	Kingfisher, Giant	Visvanger, reuse	Recorded only twice in 8 years
Ceryle rudis	Kingfisher, Pied	Visvanger, bont-	Uncommon

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Charadrius hiaticula	Plover, Ringed	Strandkiewiet, ringnek-	Regularly recorded in ones and twos in early summer
Charadrius mongolus	Plover, Mongolian	Strandkiewiet, Mongoolse	Recorder once 3 birds on one of the pans east of Lake Chrissie
Charadrius pallidus	Plover, Chestnutbanded	Strandkiewiet, rooiband-	Flagship bird for Blinkpan - always present in low numbers
Charadrius pecuarius	Plover, Kittlitz's	Strandkiewiet, geelbors-	Seen skulking around all the pans
Charadrius tricollaris	Plover, Threebanded	Strandkiewiet, drieband-	Widespread resident
Chersomanes albofasciata	Lark, Spikeheeled	Lewerik, vlakte-	Short and longer grasslands around the pans
Chlidonias hybridus	Tern, Whiskered	Sterretjie, witbaard-	Summer breeders on the vegetated pans
Chlidonias leucopterus	Tern, Whitewinged	Sterretjie, witvlerk-	Flock up to 00 strong occur in summer on Lake Chrissie
Chrysococcyx klaas	Cuckoo, Diederik	Diederikkie	Regularly seen during summer
Ciconia ciconia	Stork, White	Ooievaar, wit-	Flocks gather on the newly mown fields in summer
Ciconia nigra	Stork, Black	Ooievaar, grootswart-	Only 1 record of 3 storks on a pan near Blinkpan
Circus aeruginosus	Harrier, Marsh, European	Vleivalk, Europese	Recorded in eighties by Allan. Seen once in current survey
Circus ranivorus	Harrier, Marsh, African	Vleivalk, Akrikaanse	Vagrant - rarely seen around the reed pans
Cisticola brunnescens	Cisticola, Palecrowned	Klopkoppie, bleekkop-	The common Cisticola in the Lake Chrissie pans
Cisticola juncidis	Cisticola, Fantailed	Kopkloppie, landery-	Not common
Cisticola tinniens	Cisticola, Levaillant's	Tinktinkie, vlei	Seen near the pans
Colius striatus	Mousebird, Speckled	Muisvoël, gevlekte-	Around farmhouses with fruit orchards
Columba guinea	Pigeon, Rock	Duif, krans-	Common in the low areas around Blinkpan
Corvus alba	Crow, Pied	kraai, witbors-	Lake Chrissie location
Coturnix coturnix	Quail, Common	Kkwartel, Afrikaanse	Only seen when flushed driving through long grass to pans.
Coturnix delegorguei	Quail, Harlequin	Kwartel, bont-	Readily identified by its call in summer - seldom seen
Cuculus clamosus	Cuckoo, Black	Koekoek, swart-	Only recorded once in a stand of pines
Cuculus solitarius	Cuckoo, Redchested	Piet-my-vrou	Invariable heard in summer - seldom seen
Dendrocygna bicolor	Duck, Fulvous	Eend, fluit-	Vagrant. Recorded 3 times in 8 years
Dendrocygna viduata	Duck, White-faced	Eend, nonnetjie-	Vagrant, Recorded on 3 occasions in 8 years
Egretta alba	Egret, Great White	Reier, grootwit-	Most widely distributed of the Egrets, up to 37 on Grasspans
Egretta ardesiaca	Egret, Black	Reier, swart-	Only recorded 11 birds in 8 years on Lake Chrissie (2004)
Egretta garzetta	Egret, Little White	Reier, kleinwit-	Uncommon, same habitat as the Great White
Egretta intermedia	Egret, Yellowbilled	Reier, geelbekwit-	Uncommon, easily confused with the Great White
Elanus caeruleus	Kite, Blackshouldered	Valk, blou-	Resident
Estrilda trild	Waxbill, Common	Sysie, rooibek-	Small flocks near sedge-lined pans
Euplectes afer	Bishop, Golden	Vink, goudgeel-	Widespread in grasslands
Euplectes albonotatus	Widow, Whitewinged	Flap, witvlerk-	Grassy vleis
Euplectes axillaris	Widow, Redshouldered	Flap, kortstert-	Not common
Euplectes orix	Bishop, Red	Vink, rooi-	Widespread - males in breeding plumage flock together
Euplectes progne	Widow, Longtailed	Flap, langstert-	Widespread seen all the time
Eupodotis caerulescens	Korhaan, Blue	Korhaan, blou-	Resiedent - more often seen than heard

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Falco amurensis	Falcon, Amur	Valk, oostelike rooipoot-	Less often recorder than the Red-footed Falcon
Falco biarmicus	Falcon, Lanner	Valk, edel-	Only recorded twice in 8 years
Falco tinnunculus	Kestrel, Rock	Valk, krans-	Uncommon - seen around the larger rock boulders
Falco verspertinus	Falcon/Kestrel, RedfootedWestern	Valk, westerlike rooipoot-	Common summer visitor
Francolinus africanus	Francolin, Greywing	Patrys, berg-	Only recorded around Eilandsmeer - uncommon
Francolinus levaillantii	Francolin, Redwing	Patrys, rooivlerk-	One recorded near Graspan
Francolinus swainsonii	Francolin, Swainson's	Fisant, bosveld-	Widespread and common
Fulica cristata	Coot, Redknobbed	Bleshoender	Seen on any sheet of water - up to 2000 on pans
Gallinago nigripennis	Snipe, African	Snip, Afrikaanse	Up to 26 on one pan in dry conditions
Gallinula angulata	Moorhen, Lesser	Waterhoender, klein-	Vagrant, recorded twice in 8 years
Gallinula chloropus	Moorhen	Waterhoender, groot-	Irregularly seen on the reed pans
Geronticus calvus	Ibis, Bald	Ibis, kalkoen-	Regularly recorder feeding in flocks on newly mown fields
Glareola nordmanni	Pranticole, Blackwinged	Sprinkaanvoël, swartvlerk-	Recorder on two consecutive summers over Lake Chrissie
Grus carunculata	Crane, Wattled	Kraanvoël/lel-	Single birds recorder on two occasions near Blinkpan
Haliaeetus vocifer	Eagle, Fish, African	Arend, vis-	Irregular vagrant, only recorder twice in 8 years
Himantopus himantopus	Stilt, Blackwinged	Elsie, rooipoot-	Widespread, numbers rise when pans start drying up
Hirundo albigularis	Swallow, Whitethroated	Swael, witkeel-	Around and strems feeding the pans
Hirundo cuculatta	Swallow, Striped, Greater	Swael, grootstreep-	Grasslands
Hirundo fuligula	Martin, Rock	Swael, krans-	Sporadically seen
Hirundo rustica	Swallow, European	Swael, Europese	Plentiful in summer
Indicator indicator	Honeyguide, Greater	Heuningwyser, groot-	Picked up by call seldom seen
Lamprotornis nitens	Starling, Glossy Cape	Spreeu, kleingans-	Around farmhouses
Lanius collaris	Shrike, Fiscal	Laksman, fiskaal-	Widely distributed
Larus cirrocephalus	Gull, Greyheaded	Meeu, gryskop-	Subject to movement in and out of pans. 50 pairs nest in Grasslands
Leptoptilos crumeniferus	Stork, Marabou	Maraboe	One record of 11 storks circling the abbatoir at Lake Chrissie
Lophaetus occipitalis	Eagle, Longcrested	Arend, langkuif-	One recorder in blu gum plantation near Lake Banagher
Lybius torquatus	Barbet, Blackcollared	Houtkapper,rooikop-	Limited by the scarcity of trees
Macronyx capensis	Longclaw, Orangethroated	Kalkoentjie, oranjekeel-	Another typical Lake Chrissie bird
Merops apiaster	Bee-eater, European	Byvreter, Europese	Regular summer visitor
Microparra capensis	Jacana, Lesser	Langtoon, dwerg-	Recorded only by Allan - most unusual record
Milvus migrans migrans	Kite, Black	Wou, swart-	Summer visitor
Milvus migrans parasitus	Kite, Yellowbilled	Wou, geelbek-	Summer visitor
Mirafra ruddi	Lark, Rudd's	Lewerik, Drakensberg-	Partial to the short grass on eastern shore of Lake Chrissie
Motacilla capensis	Wagtail, Cape	Kwikkie, gewone	Small numbers adjoining the pans
Motacilla flava	Wagtail, Yellow	Kwikkie, geel-	Recorder 4 times, all on different pans
Mycteria ibis	Stork, Yellowbilled (Wood Ibis)	Nimmersat	1 or 2 birds regularly recorded on Lake Chrissie
Myrmecocichla formicivora	Chat, Anteating	Piek, swart-	One of the most characteristic birds of the grasslands

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Nectarinia amethystina	Sunbird, Black	Suikerbekkie, swart-	Farm gardens
Nectarinia famosa	Sunbird, Malachite	Jangroentjie	Seen twice, once in a shrub in village and in wild dagga on Graspan
Neotis ludwigii	Bustard, Stanley's	Pou, veld-	Virtually extinct in Chrissie area - recorded once in 8 years
Netta erythrophthalma	Pochard, Southern	Eend, bruin-	Highly irregular, have recorded several hundred on one fresh water pan
Numenius arquata	Curlew	Wulp, groot-	Two unexpected sightings on open pans in 8 ears
Numida meleagris	Guineafowl, Helmeted	Tarentaal, gewone	Widespread
Nycticorax nicticorax	Heron, Night, Blackcrowned	Reier, gewone nag	Seen in reedbeds and roosting in the willows - Tweeling pan
Oena capensis	Dove, Namaqua	Duifie, Namakwa-	Irregular visitor
Oenanthe monticola	Chat, Mountain	Bergwagter	Recorder twice on boulders near rocky pans
Ohilomachus pugnax	Ruff	Kemphaan	Strong preference for flooded grasslands. Flocks up ta 57
Onychognathus morio	Starling, Redwinged	Spreeu, rooivlerk-	Village and old buildings
Oriolus larvatus	Oriole, Blackheaded	Wielewaal, swartkop-	In the Exotic tree plantations
Ortygospiza atricollis	Finch, Quail	Vinkie, gewone kwartel-	Not often seen
Passer domesticus	Sparrow, House	Mossie, huis-	Village and from buildings
Passer melanurus	Sparrow, Cape	Mossie, gewone	Farmhouses and fields
Phalacrocorax africanus	Cormorant, Reed	Rietduiker	Partial to the flooded pans
Phalacrocorax carbo	Cormorant, Whitebreasted	Witborsduiker	Widely distributed, partial to the lakes
Phoenicopterus minor	Lesser Flamingo	Flamink, klein-	Generally confined to Blinkpan (up to 2000) and Lake Chrissie (200)
Phoenicopterus ruber	Flamingo, Greater	Flamink, groot-	Odd birds present for most of the year. Numbers can rise to 200
Platalea alba	Spoonbill, African	Aar, lepel-	Always present on the pans in small numbers
Plectropterus gambensis	Goose,Spurwinged	Makou, wilde-	Vyes with the Egyptian Goose as the most abundant water bird
Plegadis falcinellus	Ibis, Glossy	Ibis, glans-	Numbers fluctuate markedly. Partial to flooded areas in the pans
Ploceus capensis	Weaver, Cape	Werwer, Kaapse	Widespread
Ploceus velatus	Weaver, Masked	Vink,swartkeelgeel-	Widespread - nests on fences and willow trees
Pluvialis fulva	Plover, Golden, Pacific	Strandkiewiet, oosterse goue	Seen several times in the course of 2 days on Lake Chrissie
Pluvialis squatarola	Plover, Grey	Strandkiewiet, grys-	Seen once on a sandy shore on a pan just east of Lake Chrissie
Podiceps cristatus	Grebe, Black Necked	Dobbertjie, swartnek	Vagrant. Seen on saline and sedge-lined pans
Podiceps nigricollis	Grebe, Great Crested	Dobbertjie, kuifkop-	Resident. Occures in all the Pans
Polyboroides typus	Gymnogene	Valk, kaalwang-	Vagrant - rarely seen - occurred near the gum and oak trees
Porphyrio porphyrio	Gallinule, Purple	Riethaan, grootkoning-	Number vary with pan conditions - up to 70 on one grassy pan
Porzana pusilla	Crake, Baillon's	Riethaan, klein-	Vagrant, only record is in the eighties (Allan)
Pycnonotus barbatus	Bulbul, Blackeyed	Tiptol, swartoog-	Around th farm houses
Quelea quelea	Quelea, Redbilled	Kwelea, rooibek-	Small loose flocks in grasslands
Rallus caerulescens	Rail, African	Riethaan, groot-	One record - seen in a muddy bog
Recurvirostra avosetta	Avocet	Elsie, bont	Flocks arrive as the pans dry up
Riparia cincta	Martin, Banded	Swael, gebande oewer-	Feeding low over the grasslands
Riparia paludicola	Martin, Brownthroated	Swael, Afrikaanse oewer-	Vicinity of water

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Riparia riparia	Martin, Sand, European	Swael, Europese oewer-	Flocking on the fences in summer
Rostratula benghalensis	Snipe, Painted	Snip, goud-	Seen in January when Lake chrissie is really flooded
Sagittarius serpentarius	Secretary Bird	Sekretarisvoël	Rarely seen - only two records - both in the grasslands
Sarkidiornis melanotos	Duck, Knobbilled	Eend, knobbel-	Recorded by Allan, but not in the present survey - vagrant
Sarothrura rufa	Flufftail, Redchested	Vleikuiken, rooibors-	Extremely elusive - seen once in eighties and once on 2004
Saxicola torquata	Chat, Stone	Bontrokkie, gewone	Partial to wetland areas
Scopus umbretta	Hamerkop	Hamerkop	Partial to the streams feeding into the pans and lakes
Serinus atrogularis	Canary, Blackthroated	Kanarie, berg-	Small groups near homesteads
Serinus canicollis	Canary, Cape	Kanarie, Kaapse	Homesteads and tree plantations
Spreo bicolor	Starling, Pied	Spreeu, witgat-	Environs of Lake Chrissie Village
Streptopelia capicola	Dove, Turtle , Cape	Duif, gewone tortel-	Noted around the few trees in the panveld
Streptopelia decipiens	Dove, Redeyed	Duif, grootring-	Widespread over the pans
Streptopelia senegalensis	Dove, Laughing	Duifie, rooibors-	Widespread particularly arouns the kraals
Tachybaptus ruficollis	Dabchick (Little Grebe)	Dobbertjie, klein-	Resident. Numbers fluctuate throughout the year
Tadorna cana	Shelduck, South African	Eend, koper-	Not recorded in the eighties. Now seen 3 times in 8 years
Telophorus zeylonus	Bokmakierie	Bokmakierie	Farmhouse environs
Thalassornis leuconotus	Duck, Whitebacked	Eend, witrug-	Partial to floating vegetation - resident
Threskiornis aethiopicus	Ibis, Sacred	Skoorsteenveer	Widely distributed when pans have water
Trachyohonus vaillantii	Barbet, Crested	Houtkapper, kuifkop-	In the farm gardens
Tringa glareola	Sandpiper, Wood	Ruiter, bos-	Seen on most of the pans in small numbers in summer
Tringa hypoleucos	Sandpiper, Common	Ruiter, gewone	Regularly seen every summer. Prefers the rocky pans
Tringa ochropus	Greenshank/Sandpiper	Ruiter, witgat-	Seen on II the pans in low numbers in summer
Tringa stagnatilis	Sandpiper, Marsh	Ruiter, moeras-	Single birds regularly seen on the vegetated pans every summer
Tringa totanus	Redshank	Ruiter, rooipoot-	Recorded once on the mudflats - Koolbank December 2003
Turdus olivaceus	Thrush, Olive	Lyster, olyf-	In the farmhouse gardens
Turnix sylvatica	Quail, Kurrichane Butter	Kwarteltjie, bosveld-	Only seen when flushed by a vehicle
Tyto alba	Owl, Barn	Uil, nonnetjie-	Uncommon
Tyto capensis	Owl, Grass	Uil, gras-	Rarely observed
Upupa epops	Hoopoe, African	Hoephoep	Seen amongst the farmhouses
Vanellus coronatus	Plover, Crowned	Kiewiet, kroon-	Widespread on short grass away from water
Vanellus senegallus	Plover, Wattled	Kiewiet, lel-	Uncommon, presumably resident
Vidua macroura	Whydah, Pintailed	Rooibekkie, koning-	Widely distributed
Zosteropos pallidus	White-eye, Cape	Glasogie, Kaapse	Farm gardens
